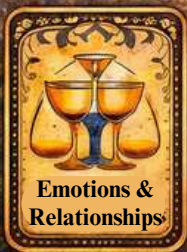

Introduction: What Is Tarot?

Tarot is a symbolic system used for guidance, reflection, spiritual insight, and personal growth. A tarot deck contains 78 cards, each carrying layered meanings that speak to life experiences, emotions, challenges, and spiritual lessons. Tarot does not predict fate in a fixed way; instead, it reflects energies, choices, and possibilities, helping you understand where you are and how to move forward with awareness.

This guide is written for beginners, using clear language and intuitive explanations. You do not need psychic abilities to read tarot—only openness, curiosity, and practice.

How to Use Tarot Cards

1. Preparing Your Deck

- Cleanse your deck when you first receive it (smoke, moonlight, intention, or prayer).
- Hold the cards and set an intention: *“May these cards guide me with clarity and truth.”*
- Store your deck respectfully.

2. Asking Questions

How To Do Your First Tarot Reading

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How To Do Your First Tarot Reading

Starting your first tarot reading is not about being psychic. It is about being present, intuitive, and honest with yourself.

Tarot is a conversation between:

- Your mind
- Your heart
- Your spirit
- Your higher wisdom

In African spiritual philosophy, divination is not fortune-telling. It is guidance. It helps you see clearly, reflect deeply, and move wisely.

Step 1: Prepare Your Space

Choose a quiet place where you feel calm. You may:

- Light a candle
- Burn incense or herbs
- Say a short prayer
- Take three deep breaths

Step 5: Reflect, Don't Fear

Tarot does not predict a fixed fate. It shows:

You always have free will.

Even challenging cards are teachers — not punishments.

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Daily Tarot Spread

1-Card Daily Pull

For emotional or spiritual clarity:

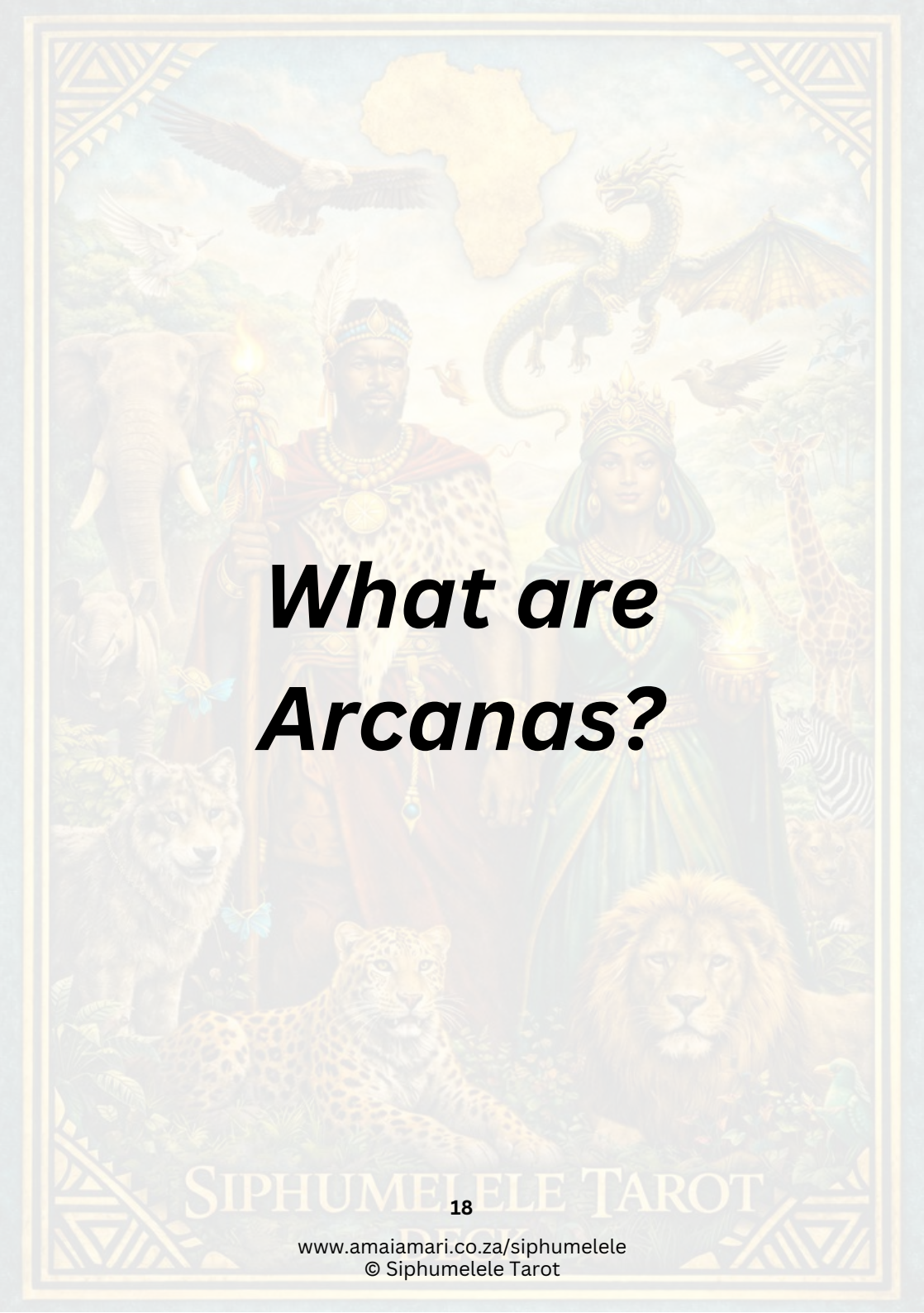
1. What I Feel

WHAT THE MAJOR ARCANA CARDS REPRESENT

A Beginner's Guide to Understanding Their Power and Meaning

The Major Arcana consists of 22 cards that represent the most powerful themes in the tarot deck. These are not everyday events or minor situations — they symbolize life-changing experiences, spiritual lessons, destiny, and deep personal transformation.

If tarot is a story of the human journey, the Major Arcana is the main storyline.

1. THE SOUL'S JOURNEY

The Major Arcana represents the journey of the soul from innocence to wisdom. This journey is often called "The Fool's Journey."

- It begins with The Fool, symbolizing new beginnings and trust.
- It moves through lessons of power, love, authority, intuition, conflict, surrender, transformation, and awakening.
- It ends with The World, representing completion and spiritual wholeness.

This journey mirrors real life. Every person experiences:

- Beginnings
- Growth
- Challenges
- Loss
- Transformation
- Enlightenment

The Major Arcana shows these stages symbolically.

2. MAJOR LIFE THEMES

The Major Arcana represents big themes such as:

- Vision and ideas
- Motivation and ambition
- Confidence and leadership
- Spiritual calling

In the Siphumelele Tarot, the Suit of Wands reflects African spiritual wisdom about life force energy – the inner flame that connects you to purpose, courage, and ancestral strength.

WHAT FIRE REPRESENTS

Fire is powerful. It can warm and illuminate – or burn and destroy. The Suit of Wands reflects both sides of passion.

When balanced, Wands energy brings:

- Confidence

The Suit of Cups represents the realm of the heart. These cards are connected to emotions, relationships, intuition, dreams, and spiritual sensitivity. If the Suit of Wands is fire (action and passion), the Suit of Cups is water — flowing, feeling, and deeply intuitive.

Cups reflect your emotional world:

- How you love
- How you connect
- How you feel
- How you heal
- How you listen to your intuition

In the Siphumelele Tarot, the Suit of Cups reflects African spiritual wisdom about the sacredness of the heart and ancestral guidance through dreams and intuition. Water is life. Without emotional balance, nothing grows.

WHAT WATER REPRESENTS

Water is fluid and powerful. It can nourish and cleanse — but it can also overwhelm.

When balanced, Cups energy brings:
